Lisgar Flooding Public Information Centre on Pump

Monitoring, evaluating and planning continues in relation to the flood mitigation efforts in the Lisgar District. I will share with you the latest update I requested from staff on the progress around the permanent pumping station that would automatically remove water from the Foundation Drain Collector (FDC) system if levels reached a certain point.

Over the past number of months, the City's contractor (Amec Foster Wheeler) has been undertaking complicated modelling exercises and analysis in support of the FDC Pumping Station. This assessment has now been completed which confirmed that an FDC Pump Station situated in the Cactus Gate parkette would be a suitable location. This is the same location where the Trench Dewatering System is being proposed. As such, AmecFW is proceeding with the design of both the Trench Dewatering System and the FDC Pump Station concurrently with the intent of having both tendered as one construction project.

As the FDC Pump Station and Trench Dewatering System are considered new municipal infrastructure, the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process must be followed. Part of that includes holding an Open House, which has been tentatively scheduled for June 14th at the Garry Morden Fire Training Centre on Ninth Line. Please mark this date on your calendar and plan to attend to find out more about these unique pieces of equipment.

FDC Sump Pump Subsidy Program

Most Ward 10 residents can get a sump pump installed in their home paid for by the City (up to \$6,000). The By-law to eliminate the one-half cost sharing requirement for the homeowner and to increase the maximum subsidy per household up to \$6000 was enacted on November 22, 2017. Starting April 30, 2018 New Route 104-Derry Express

MiWay Offers New Express Route on Derry

On April 30, MiWay introduced a new weekday express route along Derry Road between Meadowvale Town Centre and Westwood Square. The new Route 104 – Derry Express will operate from Monday to Friday during morning and afternoon rush hours and will only stop at major intersections. This new express Route 104 will complement the existing local service, Route 42 – Derry.

This change is one of several service improvements and connections on routes across the city. MiWay customers will also notice improved GO Transit connections, additional trips and revised schedules to improve service on many routes, including tweaks to seasonal service on Route 66 McLaughlin, 101/101A Dundas Express, 107 Malton Express and 110 University Express.

These service improvements are part of Year Three of the MiWay Five Service Plan (2016-2020). This plan is moving MiWay's transit service to a grid network that will allow more frequent bus service along the city's main corridors, such as Derry Road.

Now that spring rains are here, residents often think about stormwater around their home. The City's stormwater system carries stormwater away from homes and businesses to keep people, properties and the natural environment safe. There are many parts to this complex system where some are visible and some are underground. You may see roadside catchbasins, ditches, pipes, watercourses, creeks, the Credit River, stormwater management ponds and roads helping to carry stormwater runoff to Lake Ontario. Freedom Pass

Need some freedom this summer? The Freedom Pass is back! Mississauga youth aged 12 to 14 years can apply for the Freedom Pass. Youth can ride MiWay and access indoor and outdoor City pools from July 1 to August 31 for free.

Beginning May I, Freedom Pass cards will be available. Application forms can be downloaded and printed or picked up at any City of Mississauga community centre. Signed and completed application forms can be submitted at a community centre, along with one piece of identification. Applicants will also need to have

their photo taken by customer service staff to create a personalized Freedom Pass. Last year, almost 7,000 youth participated in the program.











Council held a very successful first event for the community: a Youth Expo that featured 20 organizations that provide services for youth. Two keynote speakers offered inspiring words to the more than 100 who attended. Great work, youth councillors! City's Spring Clean Up Underway

Following a brief return to winter this past month, the City's annual Spring Clean-up Program for roads and sidewalks is now in full swing.

Street Sweeping

Spring street sweeping began on April 9 but, unfortunately, progress was delayed due unseasonable weather in mid-April. The program has since resumed with a revised timeline. All streets, including on-street bike lanes, are expected to be completed by May 25 (weather permitting). Boulevards and islands will be cleaned from May 6 to June I (weather permitting). I know that road users become eager for the streets to be swept as soon as the weather starts warming up. Thank you for your patience.

Snow Plow Sod Damage

Snow plow sod damage service requests are commonly reported at this time of year, especially after a late season storm. Sod is prone to damage by the City's equipment when the ground is soft or if there is any over growth of grass creeping onto the sidewalk. Residents can report snow plow sod damage by calling 3-1-1, using the PingStreet app or submitting a request online. The area will be noted and inspected this spring to see if sod replacement or re-seeding is required. Repairs typically take place from May-June and September-October.

Pothole Repair

Regular inspections of the City's road system network are carried out through routine patrolling according to the requirements of Minimum Maintenance Standards. In addition, residents can report potholes by calling 3-1-1, using the PingStreet app or submitting a request online. The area will be inspected within three business days of receiving a service request and made safe. If additional repairs are required, they will be completed on a priority basis as a part of the City's regular maintenance schedule.



Sidewalk Inspection and Repair

Each year, the City hires students to inspect its sidewalk network. Starting in May, these staff will walk every sidewalk in the City and record deficiencies. In addition, residents can report sidewalk damage by calling 3-1-1, using the Pingstreet app or submitting a request online. The area will be inspected within three business days of receiving a service request and made safe. If additional repairs are required, they will be completed on a priority basis as a part of our regular maintenance schedule.

Litter Clean up

Crews have begun their regularly scheduled clean-up of debris and litter on the road allowance. Residents can also report litter or dumping on the road allowance by calling 3-1-1, using the Pingstreet app or submitting a request online. Residents should call the Ministry of Transportation at 1-800-268-4686 to report litter on 400 series highway ramps.

Inlet and Outlet Cleaning

Crews have also begun to clear debris from inlets and outlets to ensure stormwater can flow freely. Residents can report any build-up of natural debris, such as leaves, large tree limbs or sediment, by calling 3-1-1.

Please be advised that if sidewalk damage, a pothole or debris in the road allowance is causing a public safety risk, residents are asked to call 3-1-1 immediately.



New On street parking bylaw

Changes to the bylaw that regulates overnight parking on the street are now in effect. The 2 am to 6 am on-street parking prohibition now applies year round instead of just during the winter months. This was done at the same time as the extension of normal on-street parking from a maximum of 3 hours up to 5 hours. Volunteer with Habitat for Humanity

The money raised in the ReStore pays all of Habitat's administrative and programming costs, ensuring donations to Habitat HM go directly to building new homes for families in need.

Habitat facilitates its ReStore and many other programs through dedicated volunteers. Whether they are in the ReStore, working on build sites, helping at the office, or fixing damaged furniture at our ReVive DIY Centre, volunteers make the dream of helping every person in Halton and Mississauga have a safe and decent place to live a little closer to reality.

Trail Reconstruction Resumes

I have been advised by staff that the outstanding upgrades to the remaining trails in Lisgar will soon be completed. Rehabilitation and paving of seven trails in Ward 10 began late last year and not all of them could be completed before the winter weather set in. Work remains on the Lisgar Meadowbrook Trail and the path around Lisgar Green Park. Weather permitting, construction will take place beginning late May and take about two weeks to complete. Please take care if you are walking in the area and, for your own safety, obey trail closure signage during this brief period of construction activity.

Distracted Driving Focus on the Road, Not Your Phone

It only takes a second with your eyes off the road while driving to have an accident. In fact, in Ontario, every 30 minutes a person is injured from distracted driving, on average. The Ministry of Transportation reports that collisions caused from distracted driving have doubled since 2000.

With those staggering statistics, the City's Road Safety Committee is encouraging residents to take action. If you can't resist looking at your phone, lock it in the glove box or in your purse in the backseat. If your vehicle is equipped with Bluetooth, take the time to sync all your devices to it so you can be hands-free. In fact, it's not just phones and hand-held devices that take driver's focus on the road. Activities like eating, putting on makeup, reading maps, choosing a play list and reading can also be distracting.

The Road Safety Committee reminds residents to keep your focus on driving while you are at the wheel. Remember, it doesn't matter whether you are driving on the highway or stopped at a red light, distraction can lead to fines, demerit points, careless driving charges and accidents.

Fines for distracted driving are \$490 or as high as \$1,000 plus three demerit points. The consequences of causing an accident are far worse. Be safe - put your phone away when driving. It could save your own or somebody else's life.


