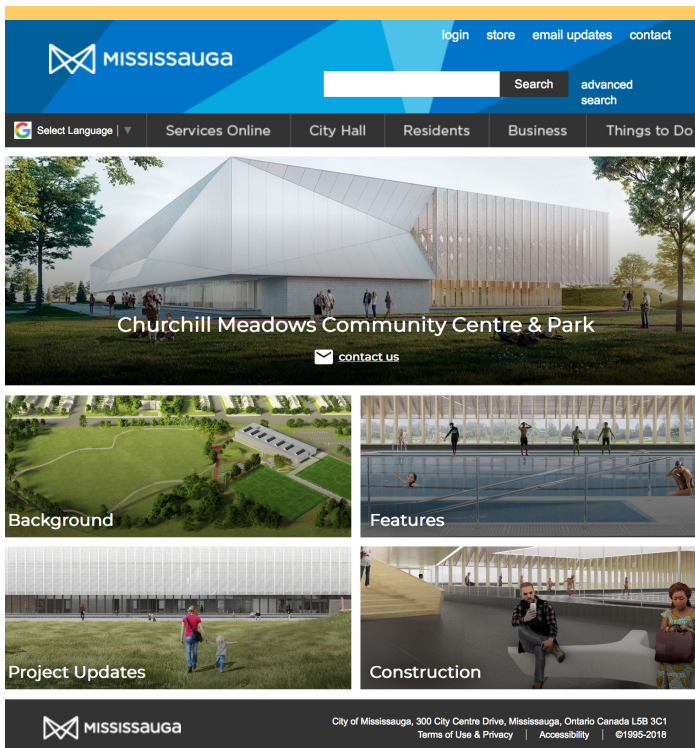

Community Centre Construction is Underway

Aquicon has begun construction on the city's newest community centre and sports park, with fencing and hoarding in place and construction vehicles mobilizing on site. The first phase of the project, located at 5320 Ninth Line (near Erin Centre Boulevard), is expected to be completed in late 2020. Residents can follow the progress via my website or a new city-managed web portal recently posted at www.mississauga.ca/churchillmeadows. It will include regular construction updates in addition to the site history, background and features. Due to municipal election rules, I will not be sending out eNews updates until after the October 22 municipal election. Lisgar Flooding Pumps at Cactus Gate

Staff, consultants and I were on hand at a Public Open House on June 14 as part of the Environmental Assessment process in presenting to the public the options and plans around installing a unique piece of infrastructure to address flooding in basements of homes situated near the Sixteen Mile Creek.

The recommended plan is to design a Utility Trench Dewatering System and Permanent Pump System, hopefully as one single below grade unit, and install it in the publically owned property along Black Walnut Trail opposite Cactus Gate. This work is still on track to take place later this year.

Don't Wait to Put In A Sump Pump

Have you considered putting in a sump pump in your home? With today's extreme weather and large storms coming more and more frequently, basement flooding becomes a significant threat to our homes and belongings. A sump pump can protect your property by moving water away from the foundation of your home. Most houses in Ward 10 are built with a three-pipe system to move water out of and away from the dwelling. If your home is eligible, you can apply to the City for a **\$6,000 subsidy** on the purchase and installation of a sump pump. Don't wait until it's too late. Freedom Pass for Youth

The City's Freedom Pass for 2018 kicks in on July 1st. Passholders receive free transit within Mississauga on MiWay buses and free swimming during drop-in swims at community centres across the city all summer long. To be eligible, youth must be 12-14 years old (born between Jan. 1, 2003 and Dec. 31, 2006). Passes are limited but still available. Upcoming Projects

Tenth Line Parking

The removal of on street parking on Tenth Line between Britannia Road and McDowell Drive is scheduled to take place this summer. I held a community open house on this matter and the report approving the parking changes was approved earlier this month.

Ninth Line / Eglinton Intersection

Improvements and lane reconfiguration at the intersection of Ninth Line and Eglinton Avenue West are still to take place later this year. The actual date for this construction project has not yet been scheduled. Mobile road signs will be installed before the start of construction to advise motorists.

Waste Pick-up Delays

As a Regional Councillor at Peel Region, my colleagues and I have been briefed again this past month by waste management staff on the ongoing delays with waste collection service. In 2016, Peel hired two contractors to collect waste from the 300,000+ residences across the region: Emterra and Waste Connections of Canada (formerly Progressive). The service performance of Waste Connections has been satisfactory, however Emterra has continually under-performed. In Ward 10, our area is serviced by Emterra and so we have been negatively impacted by this contractor's level of service. Previous attempts to address the situation, such as shifting the routes from one day to another, and having Emterra increase its fleet, have not solved the problem.

At our June meeting, Regional Council agreed with a recommendation by staff to remove one route per day (four routes per week) from Emterra and give it to Waste Connections. The idea is that Emterra, with its full complement of trucks and staff, can get to the remaining work done properly and on time. In turn, Waste Connections contract would increase by the same amount that Emterra's would decrease with no financial impact to the property tax payer.

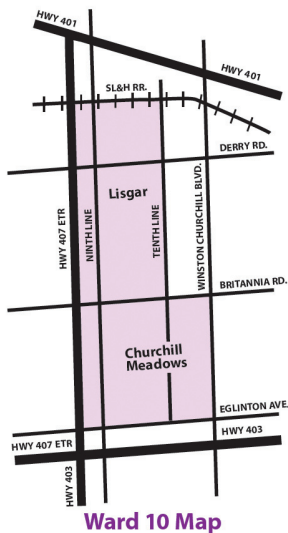
