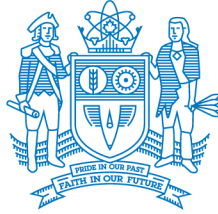

Traffic Calming on Osprey Boulevard

Dear Resident,

I am pleased to share with you that I have been able to secure some additional funding in order to have two sets of speed cushions installed on the section of Osprey Boulevard in front of St Edith Stein Catholic Elementary School.

You may recall that I sent letters to all property owners in your neighbourhood last Fall regarding issues related to speeding on various sections of Osprey Boulevard. I then followed up with a townhall meeting in November where residents could express their concern in person and hear from Peel Regional Police officers and City of Mississauga traffic experts about traffic studies and enforcement results in the area related to speeding. Based on the feedback through these public engagement opportunities, and because I was able to secure additional funds for traffic calming initiatives, I have put forward the recommendation to have speed cushions installed near the school where the data confirms the worst incidents of speeding have been recorded. General information about speed cushions as well as specific location details are included on the enclosed pages with this letter.

In addition to these speed cushions, preliminary work has already begun on installation of a raised pedestrian crossover along the Lisgar Meadowbrook Trail east of the Osprey Boulevard bridge.

Public safety – whether road safety or crime prevention – remains a top priority for me so that we can enjoy peace of mind and a high quality of life in our community and city. I want to thank the dozens of residents who expressed their concerns about speeding in this area and I am happy to offer this as a permanent, 24-hour a day solution for this area. We continue to ask for police enforcement on roads throughout Ward 10 including Osprey Boulevard but they can only attend as resources allow. Construction of these speed cushions is expected to take place this construction season, tentatively earmarked for September.
