Dear Resident,

Last year, the city's Transportation and Works department, in consultation with my office, implemented a pilot project to make our roads and neighbourhoods safer by limiting on-street parking to only one side of the street. Concerns related to snow clearing, waste collection and, most importantly, access by emergency vehicles prompted this change. It was implemented on more than 100 of our ward's narrower streets. Based on reports by the city's snow clearing team as well as comments from residents, this pilot was an unqualified success in terms of improving service delivery to residents.

In the year since, I have heard from residents living on other streets expressing similar concerns about snow removal and asking for this change to on-street parking. I also met with the city's snow clearing operations supervisor to identify additional streets that would benefit from a similar approach to on-street parking. And your street is one of them.

Later this month, signage will be installed on your street indicating on-street parking will be permitted on one side only. The side that has been selected is that which provides more space for parking; in most cases, that is the side without the fire hydrants. The overnight (2 am to 6 am) parking prohibition remains in place on the otherwise permitted side of the street, and parking considerations are still available for your overnight guests so long as vehicles are parked legally.

In order to enforce the regulation, No Parking signs will be installed at no greater than 50 metres apart. While staff will do their best to install the signs on existing light standards as much as possible, there will be some properties where a wooden post and sign will be erected within the city-owned boulevard.

Please take note of these new "No Parking" signs as they will be in effect upon installation. Based on the results of last year's pilot project, I am confident this change will improve service delivery and make your neighbourhood safer in case of emergency.
