This second community meeting will provide another opportunity for residents to view and comment on the proposed development of a medical facility and office space at 5590 Tenth Line on the southwest corner of the intersection at Thomas Street.

PLACE: Churchill Meadows Activity Centre Room A/B
3801 Thomas Street, Mississauga

Plans have been submitted to the city to develop the southwest corner of Tenth Line and Thomas Street, including medical amenities and office space.

The applicant and architect will be available to show the plans, receive comments and answer questions. Staff from the City's planning department will also be in attendance, along with myself and my Ward 10 staff. The format will be open house style to give you the freedom to drop by at your convenience between 7 and 8 pm.

One Side Only Street Parking

The roll-out of the "Clear the Way" on-street parking pilot project in Ward 10 continues with one-side only parking being implemented on several narrow streets throughout Churchill Meadows and Lisgar. Another 32 streets (or parts of streets) will have signage installed starting this month to allow parking on only one-side of the street. This follows the more than 100 streets where this was implemented during the summer. The new regulation will allow parking on one side of the street only. The catalyst for this change was addressing the many complaints around snow clearing where plows were unable to access streets due to vehicles parked on both sides. It is being implemented year-round to ensure fire and emergen-

cy service vehicles have unobstructed access as well - any time, day or night, winter or summer, to attend to emergencies.

The signage installation is expected to be completed this fall. Following the winter season, transportation staff, enforcement staff, Mississauga Fire and I will review the project and evaluate its effectiveness and if and how further improvements can be made. If your street is not part of the initial phase of this project and you feel it could benefit from one-side only parking, please send an e-mail to my office for consideration.

LANES & LIGHTS



WORK at EGLINTON and NINTH LINE

Intersection improvements continue at the corner of Eglinton Avenue and Ninth Line through the fall. New lanes are being added on Ninth Line from Eglinton north to Skyview Street. During construction, there

will be times when lanes are restricted to allow travel in only one direction at a time; motorists can expect major delays. Please avoid the area if possible. Further north on Ninth Line, two traffic signals will be installed this fall at the intersections of Burdette Terrace and Henrietta Way in preparation for the opening of the community centre next year. The road work is expected to be completed in early November.

DOOR TO DOOR SALES

Homeowners are sharing with me that door to door plumbing salespeople continue to make the rounds in our neighbourhoods, particularly in the Lisgar area. Residents are being misled by representatives from Canadian Sanitary Systems in their door-to-door sales tactics. This includes:

- Misrepresenting themselves as City of Mississauga staff;
- Advising homeowners that they are working on behalf of the City or authorized by the City to install sump pumps in the area;
- That the sump pump program is mandatory in the area;
- That a sump pump must be installed quickly;
- Scaring homeowners into thinking that their

home will flood; and

- That the subsidy would cover basement finishing and landscaping costs.

The City and Region, through their respective legal teams, have expressed their concerns directly to the plumbing company about the manner in which their salespeople are trying to persuade property owners into purchasing their products. I am also working with staff in our legal and bylaw departments to have "plumbing equipment" added to the list of banned door-to-door sales products, similar to HVAC products.

As always, anytime someone comes to your door trying to sell you something, do your research to determine the validity of the offer before you ever let them into your home or sign anything.



New Services on Pingstreet

Over the summer, I had countdown timers added to the traffic signals at Tenth Line and Thomas Street and a 50 km/hr speed sign installed at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Secondary School to improve pedestrian safety near these two high schools.

The City's Pingstreet app offers seven new services to the "Report a Problem" section.

In addition to the existing services, such as reporting a pot hole, an illegal sign, abandoned shopping cart or graffiti, residents will now be able to report the following problems using their smartphone or tablet:

PROPERTY CONCERNS

- Lighting on private property that is causing a problem
- Long grass and weeds on private property (height exceeds 8 inches (20 cm))

PARKS OPERATIONS

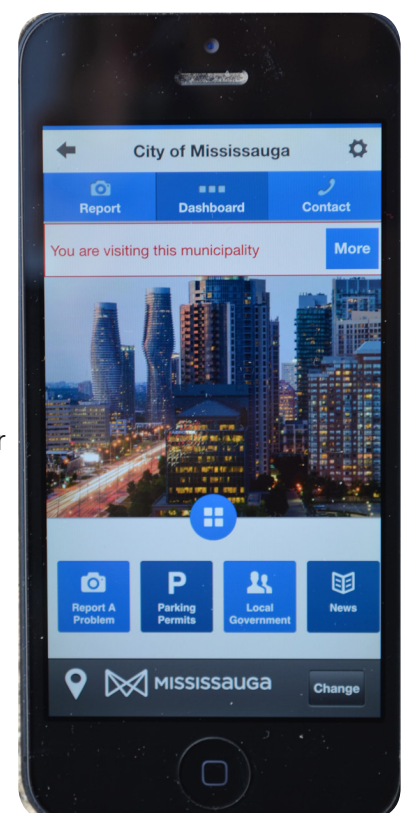
- Litter and dumping
- Grass cutting (height exceeds 3 inches (7.5 cm))
- Washroom maintenance (hand dryer malfunctions, plumbing issues)
- Sports field maintenance (debris clean up, supplies replenishment, irrigation issues)
- Overflowing garbage cans

Residents will easily be able to identify these issues within a park by either entering the park name

or selecting it from a map.

With the addition of these new services, residents can now report on 28 service areas in total. While my office is happy to receive your concerns and forward them to staff in the appropriate department, you can save time and effort by reporting directly through the app.

The Pingstreet app is free and available for download through the App Store, Google Play and BlackBerry World.





THEFT FROM VEHICLES

Mississauga, including Ward 10, continues to face a rash of attempted vehicle break-ins from would-be thieves looking for cash or valuables left in cars parked in residential driveways. Peel Police offers the following tips to protect your property.

MOST VEHICLE THEFTS HAPPEN IN:

- Large remote parking lots.
- Shopping malls.
- GO train stations.
- Movie theatres.
- Airports.
- Residential driveways and unlocked garages.

PREVENTING THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLES:

- Avoid leaving a running vehicle unattended.
- Ensure you always lock car doors and roll up your windows.
- Consider using anti-theft devices (steering wheel lock, an automatic engine shut-off, and/or a tracking device).
- Remember to lock your garage door.
- Avoid storing valuables or packages in open sight in your vehicles (place them out of sight or in the trunk).

A windrow is a pile of snow left at the end of a driveway after a snow plow has cleared a road. Eligible residents have until 9 p.m. on November 8, 2019 to apply for this year's program.

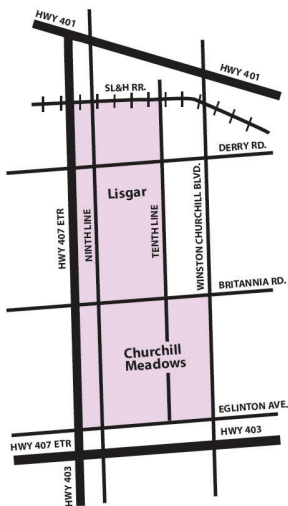
